Facility Certification

The Orange County Convention Center is a GBAC-certified facility, meaning that they have met the guidelines for cleaning and disinfecting for COVID-19 (Coronavirus, SARS-CoV-2).

Things to Know Before You Go

If you or anyone in your group does not feel well or has any of the following symptoms, please do not come to the auto show:

Fever, chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, and diarrhea.

1. We highly recommend purchasing your ticket online prior to visiting the auto show. You can save your electronic ticket(s) to your smartphone and scan them at the show entrance using our no-contact scanners.
2. Masks are mandatory and are to be worn at all times except when eating or drinking in a designated area.
3. Temperature Checks are required and will be conducted at the entrance to the show in the North Concourse lobby. The temperature checks are non-contact.
4. You will need to complete a short self-declaration prior to being allowed to enter the show floor. See the Temperature Checks section for additional information.

Temperature Checks & Security

Show management will be conducting temperature checks on attendees at the show entrance and attendees will also need to complete an online self-declaration through their cellular smart phone or through a show-provided iPad. The iPads are covered

with an anti-microbial sheet that is good for 24-hours and will be changed daily.

If you or anyone in your group does not feel well or has any of the following symptoms, please do not come to the auto show:

Fever, chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, and diarrhea.

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

In accordance with local, state, and CDC guidelines and mandates, masks are required for all exhibitors, vendors, EACs, staff, and attendees to the Central Florida International Auto Show.

The auto show will have roving “Mask Ambassadors” who will remind attendees and exhibitors to wear their mask. Anyone who refuses to comply with the PPE mandate will be escorted out of the show.

Guest Hygiene and Transmission Prevention

For the health and safety of guests, the Orange County Convention Center has placed hand-sanitizing stations throughout the concourse in the North Building. Mobile hand washing stations will be relocated to high-traffic locations throughout the concourse.

The auto show will use Medical Station #7 as a quarantine room if needed during the event.

Show management will make periodic public service announcements through an overhead microphone to remind

exhibitors, vendors, attendees and staff of proper hygiene and physical distancing. Currently, the announcement will be made every two hours starting at 11 a.m. through 8 p.m.

The Orange County Convention Center has implemented a health and safety announcement that will be played in the lobbies and concourse areas of the North Building. The overhead announcement will be played every 60 minutes starting at 8 a.m. through 8 p.m.

Test Drives

Test drives, whether they occur inside or outside the exhibit hall, require that physical distancing will be practiced among exhibitors, vendors and show attendees. Masks, a temperature check, and self-declaration are required in order to participate in any test drives.
